Distilling requirements for staff is challenging because of the variations inherent in COMAR regulations [e.g. grandfathering, and hybrid requirements for some positions (i.e. requirements for Child Care Centers for Infants, Toddlers, Preschoolers)].

## Glossary

- Core of Knowledge is a type of clock hour approved by MSDE and is the type of clock hours that count for participation in the Maryland Child Care Credential Program. In order for a workshop to be designated as Core of Knowledge clock hours the trainer must have specific credentials, the training must be specifically approved as Core of Knowledge, and the workshop/training must have an assessment successfully completed by the participant.
- Hours or Clock Hours typically refer to actual classroom hours (e.g. 3 hour workshop) that are required for renewal of license and participation in the Maryland Child Care Credential Program. Those hours must be approved by MSDE for the training to count toward renewal or the Maryland Child Care Credential Program.
- Preservice training is training typically that must be successfully completed before someone can officially be designated for a position (e.g. Child Care Teacher).
   Current MSDE practice is to approve someone for a position when they have identified training they will complete within a specific period of time (e.g. Child Care Teacher without 90 clock hours completed but with Professional Development Plan identifying (approved) training to be taken and anticipated time completed).
- Semester hours typically refer to professional development completed at an institution of higher learning that may not be awarded college credit. In some institutions of higher learning non-credit training is offered. One semester hour typically is made up of 15 clock hours of classroom time.
