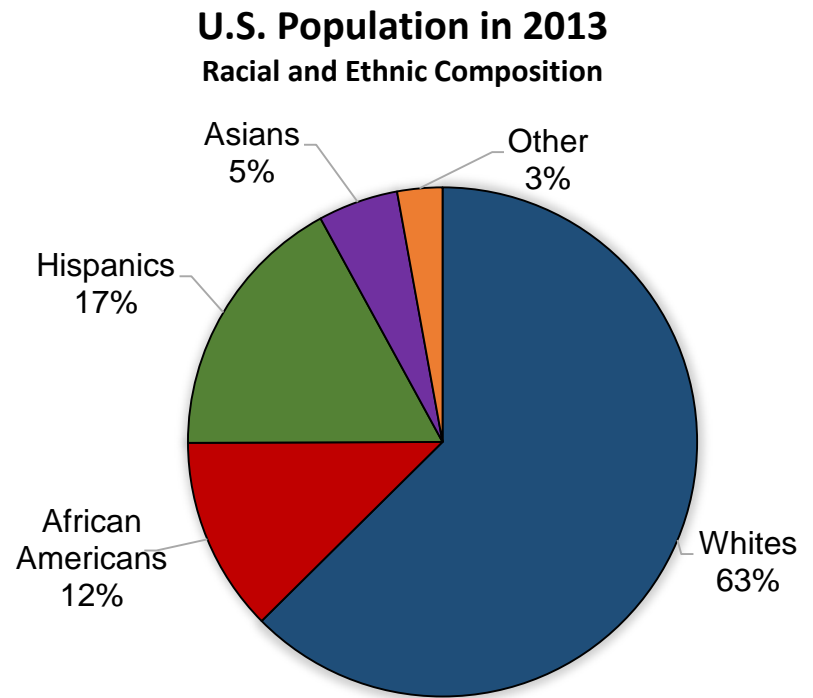

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Diversity is a Key Characteristic of the Nation's Population

- 316.1 million people live in the United States
- Non-Hispanic Whites account for nearly two-thirds of the nation's population
- Hispanics are the nation's largest minority group and fastest growing segment of the nation's population
- African Americans are the second largest minority group followed by Asian Americans



Minorities Account for a Large Share of Population in Many States

- Minorities account for 37% of the nation's population
- Hawaii leads the nation in the minority share of state population
- Maryland ranks sixth in terms of minority share of state population
- In Maryland, African Americans are the largest minority group followed by Hispanics and Asians

Several States Have Few Minorities

- In 24 states, minorities account for less than 25% of the population
- In 4 states, minorities account for less than 10% of the population
- These states tend to be smaller and are located primarily in New England, the Midwest, and the Rocky Mountain region
- Maine has the fewest minorities followed by Vermont and West Virginia

Hispanics are the Nation's Largest Minority Group

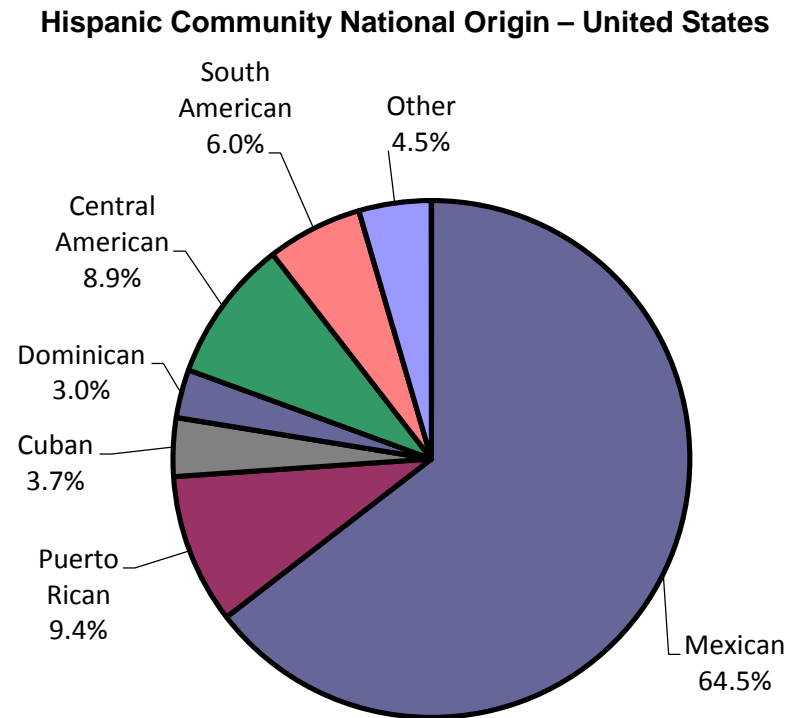
- Hispanics lead the nation in population growth
- Hispanics account for 17.1% of the nation's population
- New Mexico leads the nation in the Hispanic share of state population
- Maryland ranks twenty-fourth in terms of Hispanic share of state population

Considerable Diversity Among Hispanics

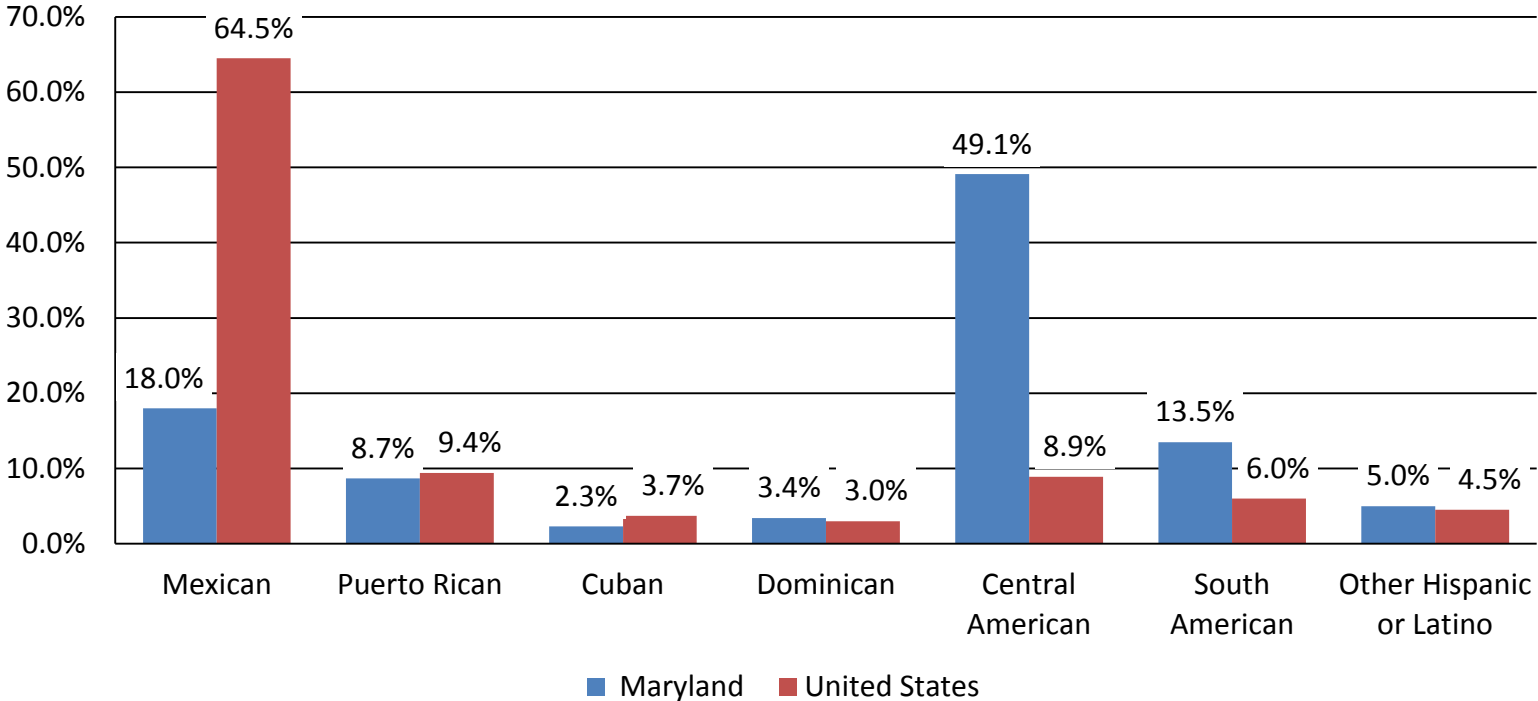
- Hispanics represent cultures from many nations and regions including Mexico, Central America, South America, and the Caribbean
- Nationally, Mexican Americans comprise the largest segment of the Hispanic community
- In Maryland, Central Americans represent the largest segment of the State's Hispanic community followed by Mexicans and South Americans

African Americans are the Nation's Second Largest Minority Group

- African Americans became the nation's second largest minority group in 2001
- African Americans account for 12.4% of the nation's population
- Mississippi leads the nation in the African American share of state population
- Maryland ranks fourth in terms of African American share of state population

- Asians account for 5.1% of the nation's population
- Hawaii leads the nation in the Asian share of state population
- Maryland ranks seventh in terms of Asian share of state population

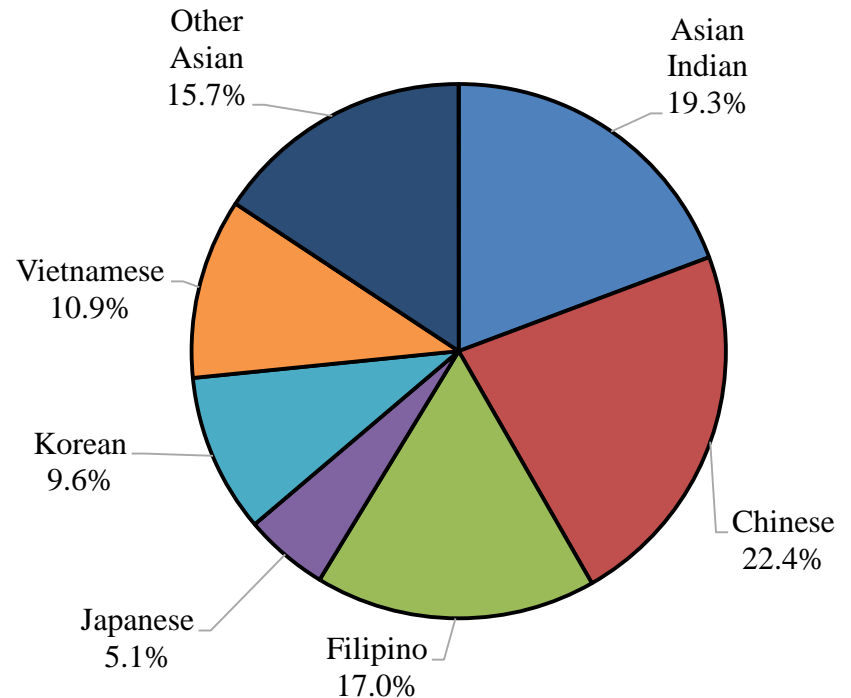

Considerable Diversity Among Asians

- Asian Americans represent cultures from many nations and regions including China, India, the Philippines, Vietnam, and Korea
- Nationally, Chinese comprise the largest segment of the Asian community, followed by Indians and Filipinos
- In Maryland, Indians represent the largest segment of the State's Asian community followed by Chinese, Filipinos, and Koreans

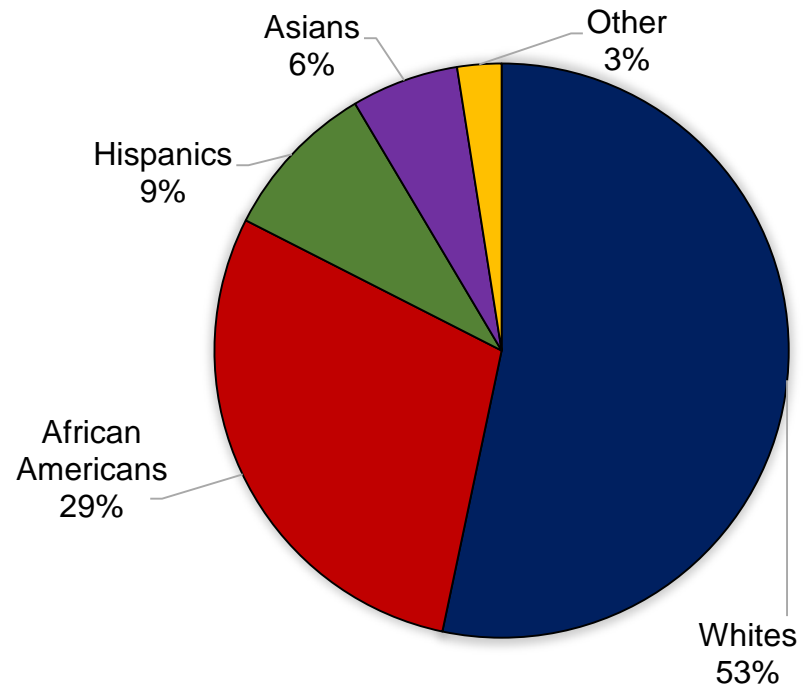

Hispanic Community in Maryland is Relatively Small

- Nearly 535,000 Hispanics live in Maryland
- Hispanics are the second largest minority group in the State
- Hispanics account for 9.0% of the State's population
- Montgomery and Prince George's counties are home to most of the State's Hispanics

Hispanic Presence is Strongest in Montgomery and Prince George's Counties

- Over two-thirds of the State's Hispanics live in Montgomery and Prince George's counties
- Hispanics account for 18.3% of residents in Montgomery County and 16.2% of residents in Prince George's County
- Silver Spring, Wheaton-Glenmont, Germantown, and Gaithersburg are major locations for Hispanics in Montgomery County
- Langley Park, Chillum, Riverdale, and Hyattsville are major locations for Hispanics in Prince George's County

African American Community in Maryland is Relatively Large

- Over 1.7 million African Americans live in Maryland
- African Americans are the largest minority group in the State
- African Americans account for 29.2% of the State's population
- Prince George's County and Baltimore City are home to a majority of the State's African Americans

African American Presence is Strongest in Prince George's County and Baltimore City

- 55% of African Americans live in Prince George's County and Baltimore City
- African Americans account for 63% of residents in both Prince George's County and Baltimore City
- Somerset and Charles counties also have a considerable number of African Americans in relation to the county's total population
- Garrett and Carroll counties have the fewest African Americans

- Asians are the third largest minority group in the State
- Asians account for 6.0% of the State's population
- Montgomery County is the main destination for the State's Asian community

Asian Presence is Strongest in Montgomery and Howard Counties

- Asians account for 14.7% of residents in Montgomery County and 16.1% of residents in Howard County
- In Montgomery County, the Asian community is dispersed throughout the county
- In Howard County, major locations for Asians include Ellicott City and Columbia
- Western Maryland counties of Allegany and Garrett and the Eastern Shore counties of Caroline and Somerset have the smallest Asian presence

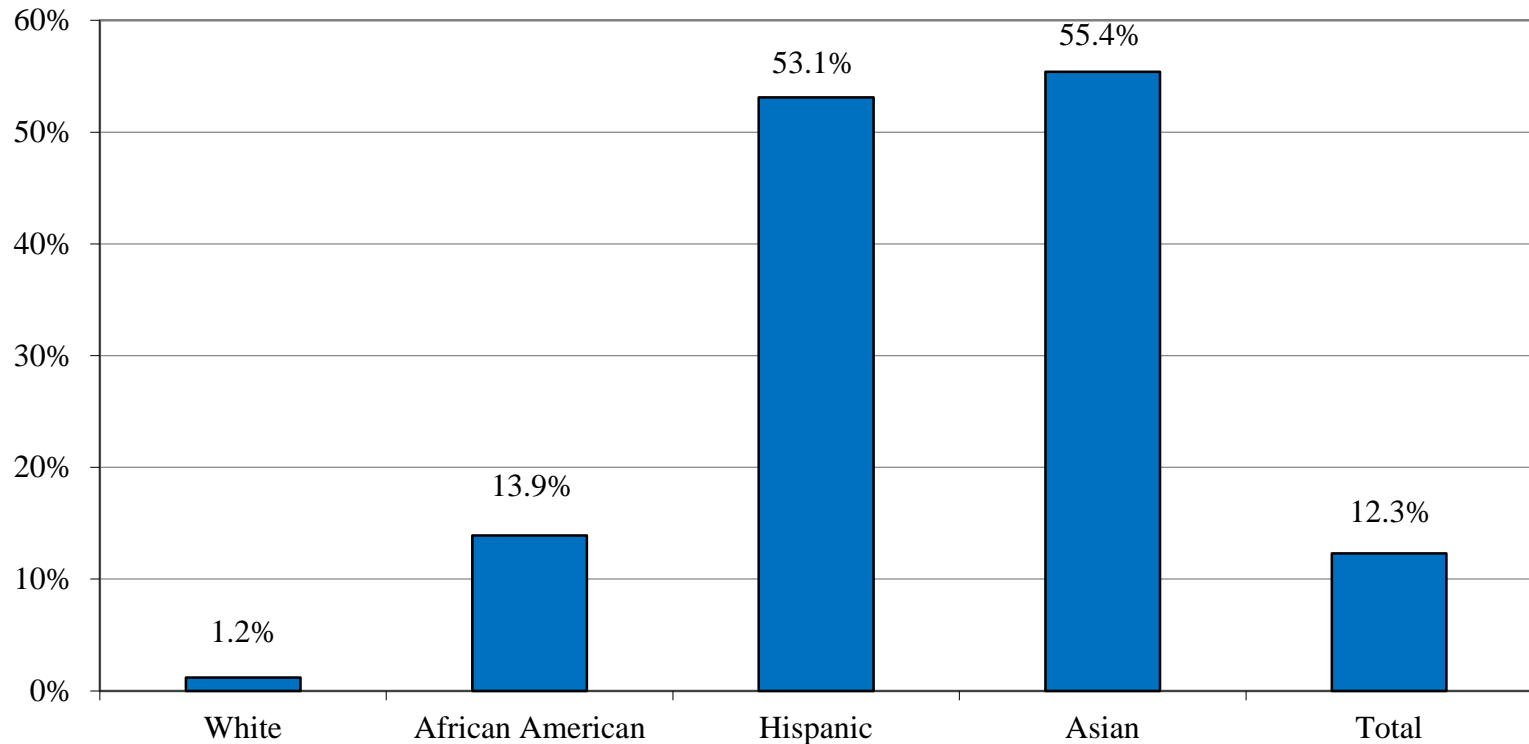

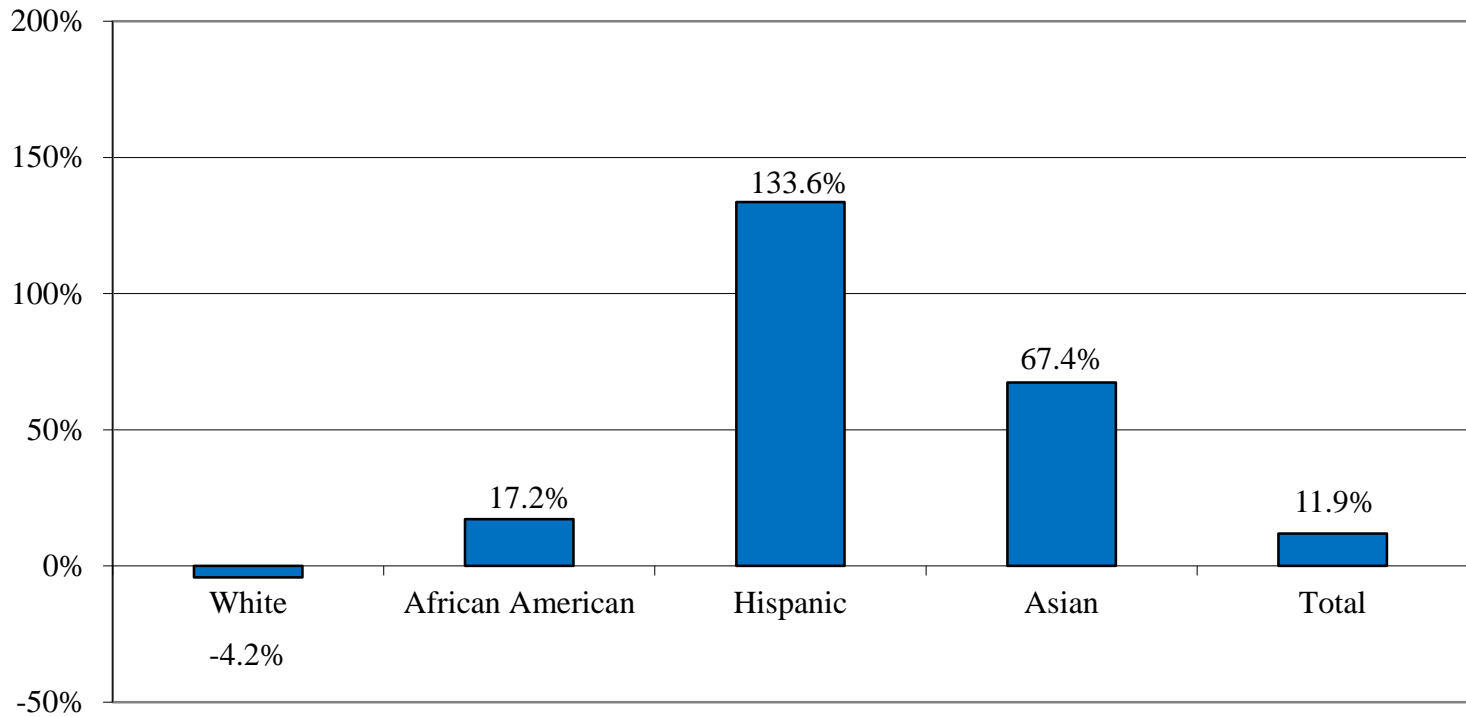

Maryland Experiences Modest Population Growth Since 2000

- The State's population has increased by 11.9% in the last 13 years resulting in an additional 632,300 residents
- Montgomery, Prince George's, and Baltimore counties accounted for nearly one-half of the population gain
- Southern Maryland had the highest growth rate on a percentage basis followed by Frederick and Howard counties
- Only two jurisdictions, Allegany County and Baltimore City, realized a decrease in their population during this period

Most Counties in Maryland Realize Significant Increases in Minority Population Since 2000

- The gains in the State's population have been comprised entirely from growth in minority groups
- Since 2000, the State's minority population has increased by 38.7%; whereas, the non-Hispanic White population has decreased by 4.2%
- Over 60% of the minority population increase has occurred in three counties – Montgomery, Prince George's, and Baltimore
- Baltimore City was the only jurisdiction in Maryland that realized a decrease in its minority population during this period

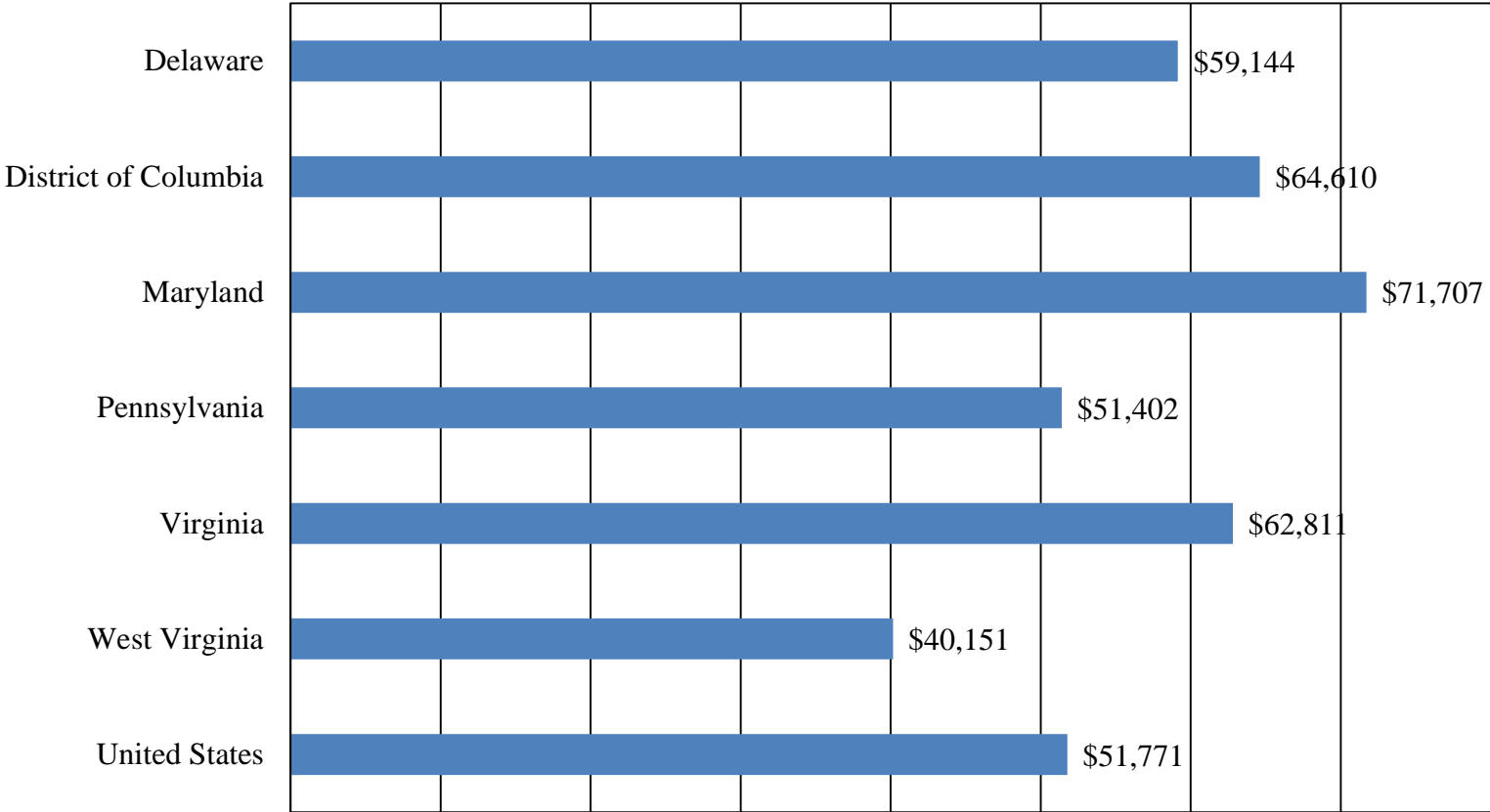

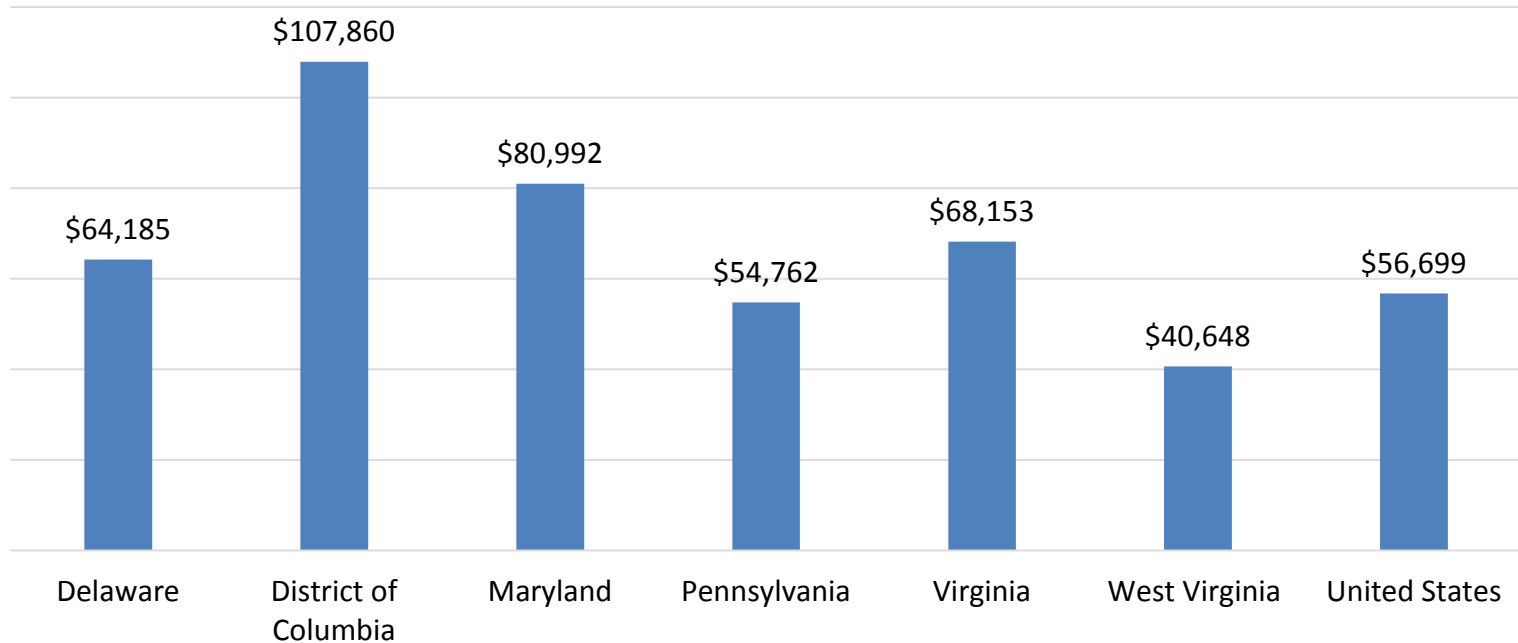

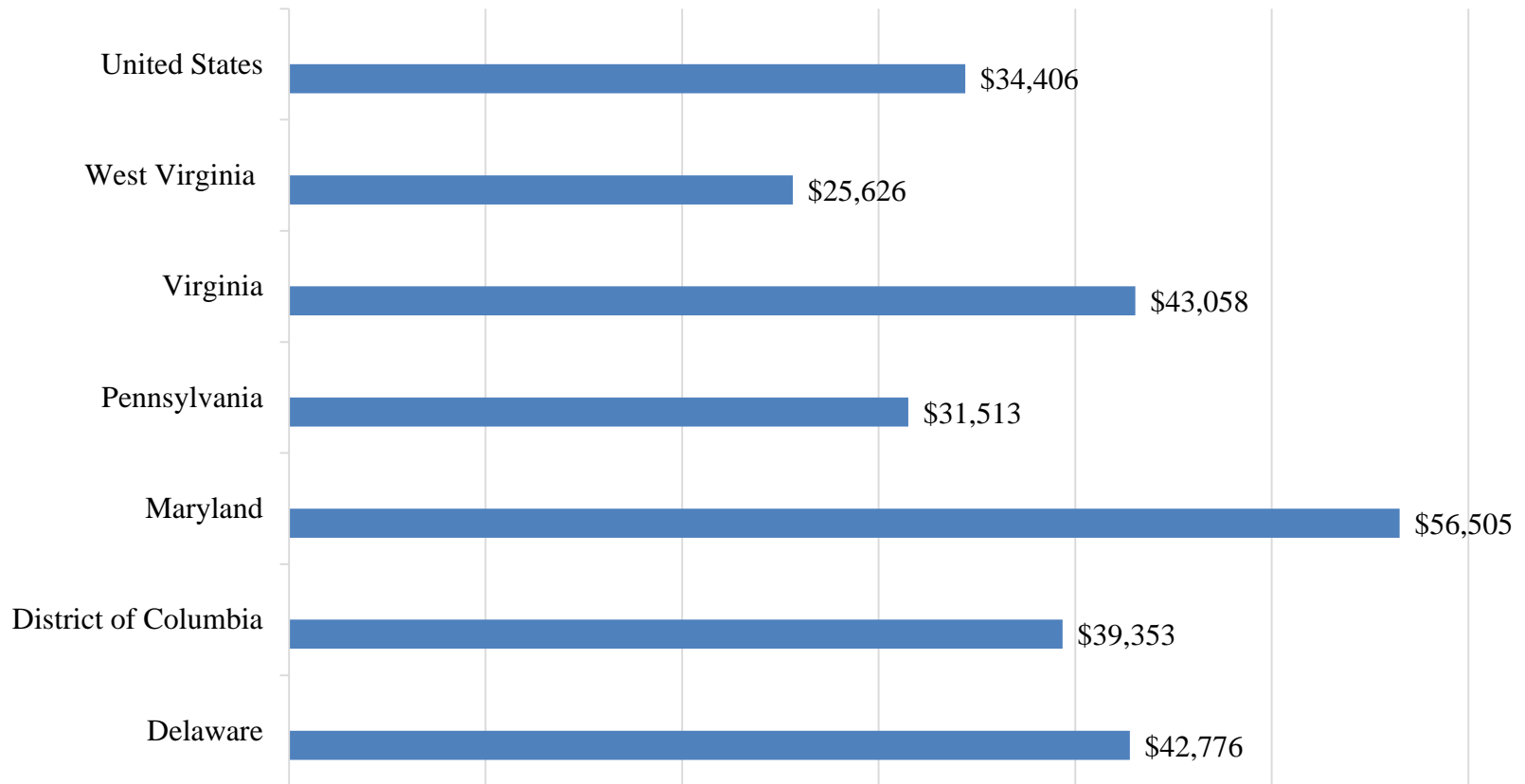

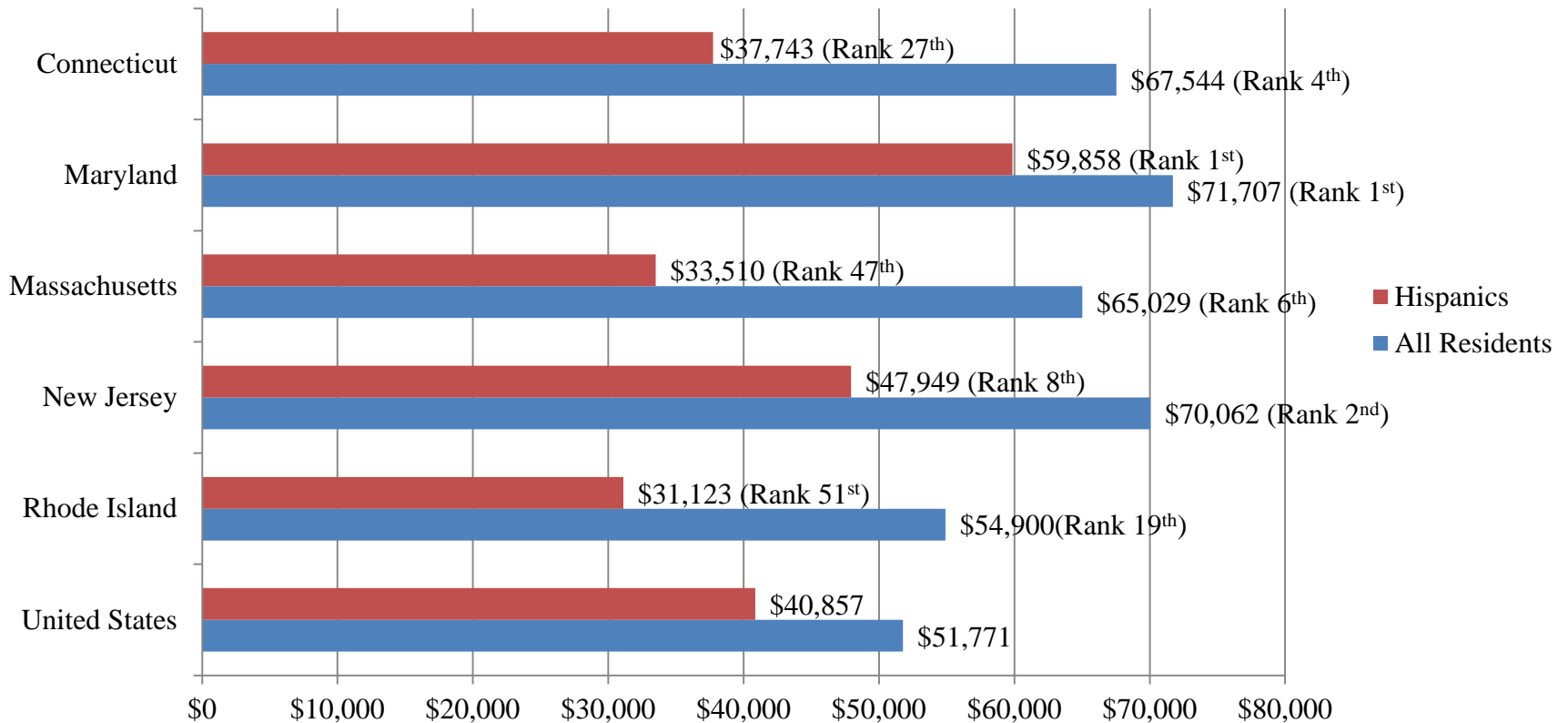

Hispanics in Maryland Lead Northeastern States in Income

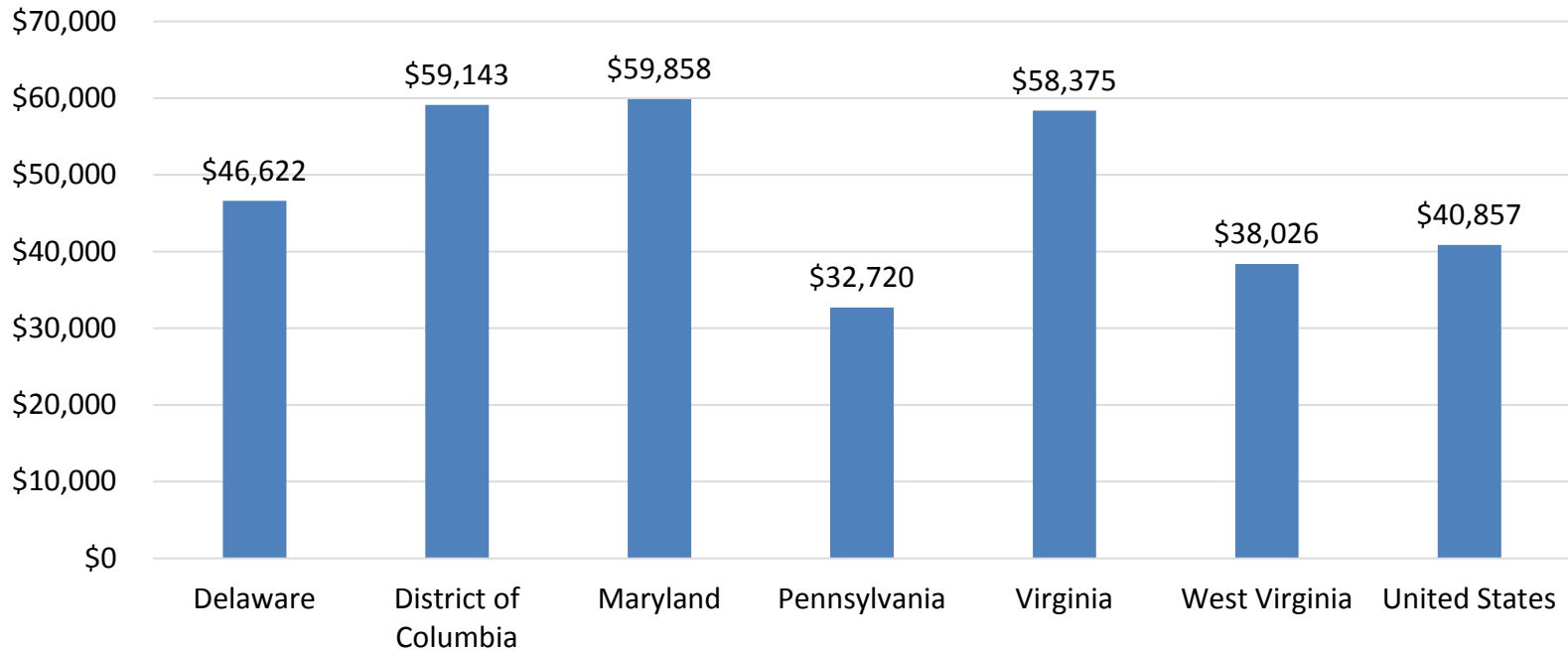
Median Household Income for Hispanics and All Residents

Hispanics in Maryland Have Higher Median Household Income than Surrounding States

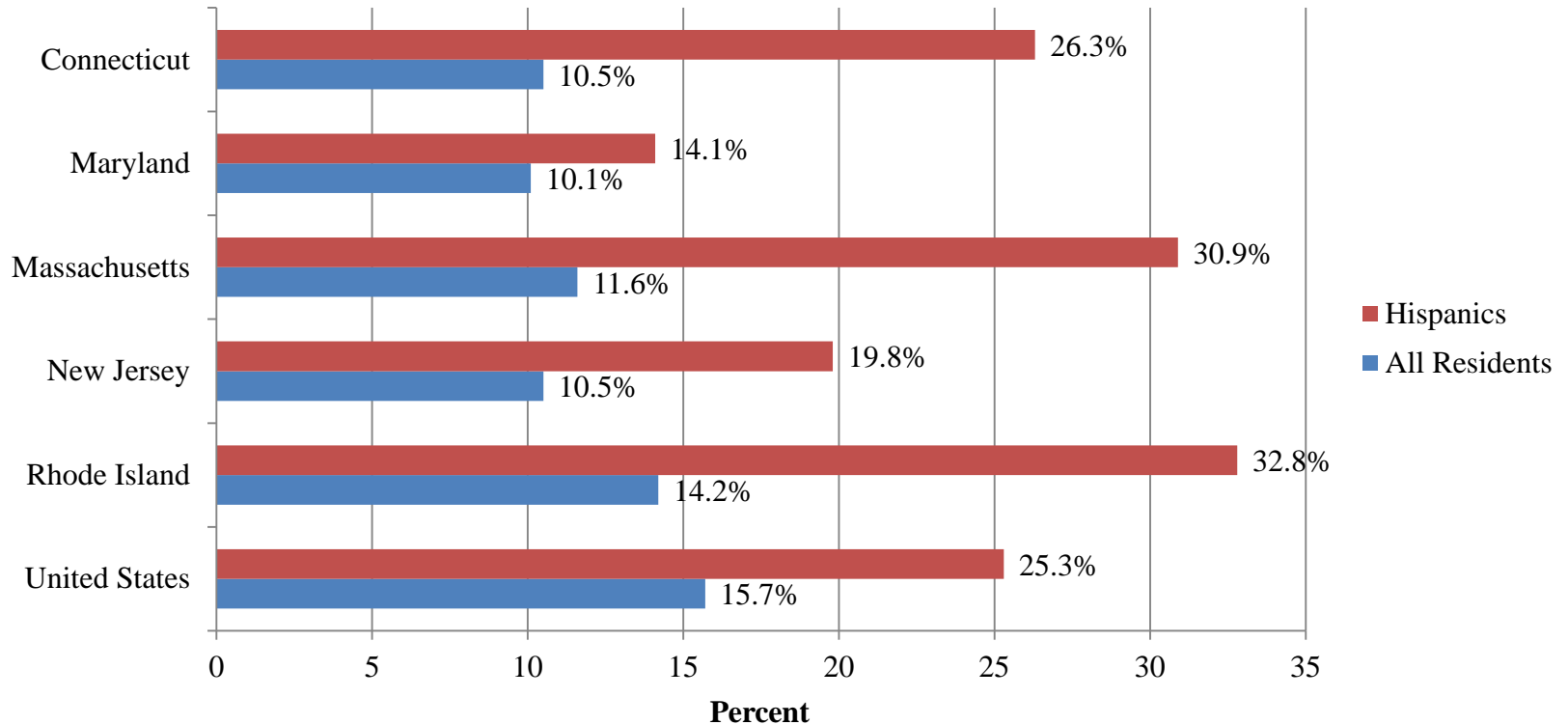
Median Household Income for Hispanic Population

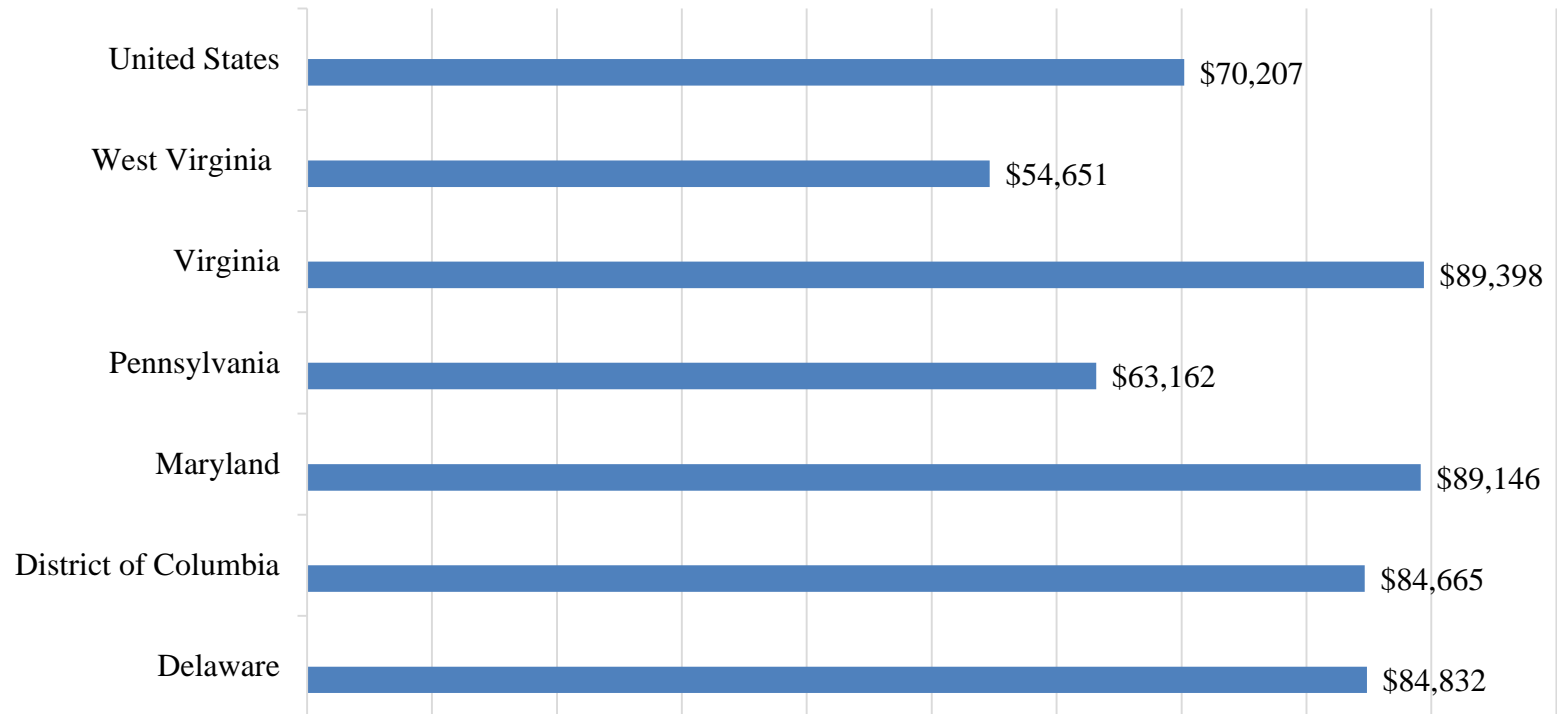

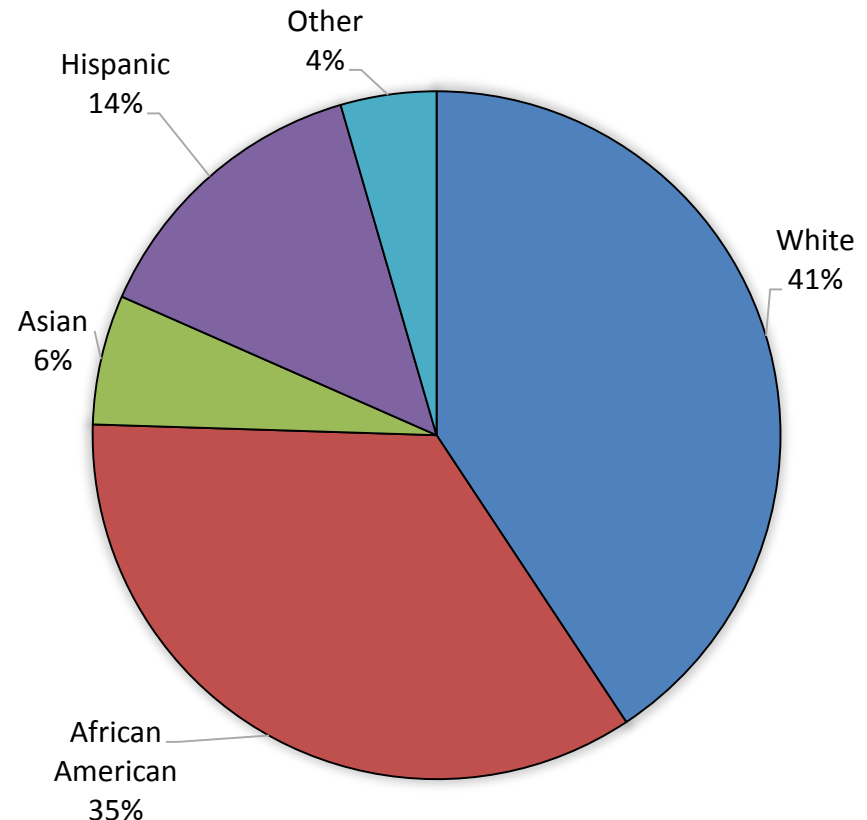

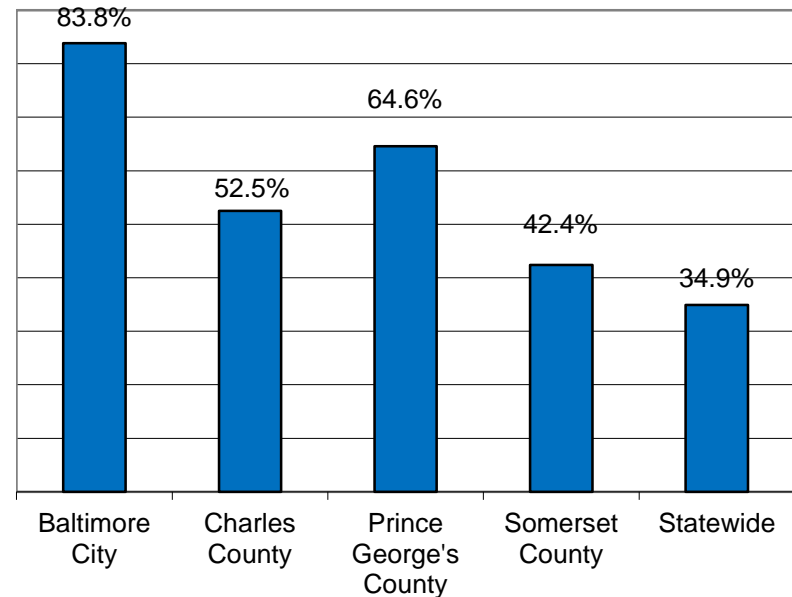

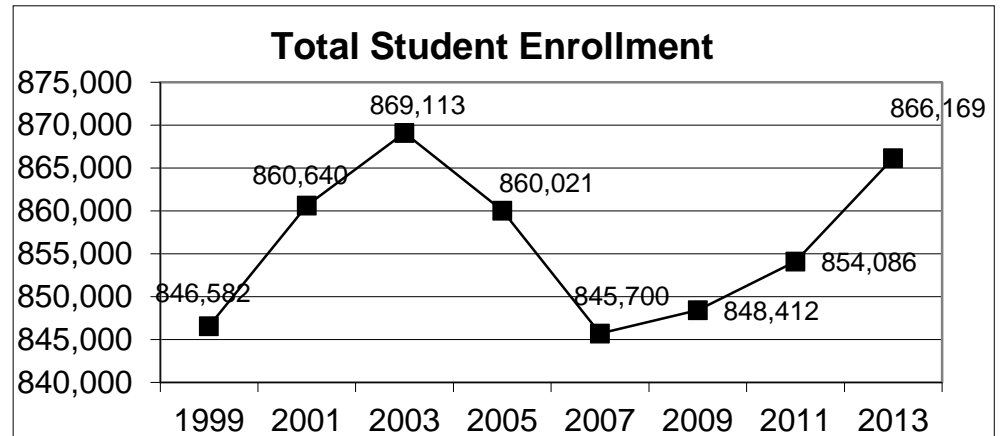
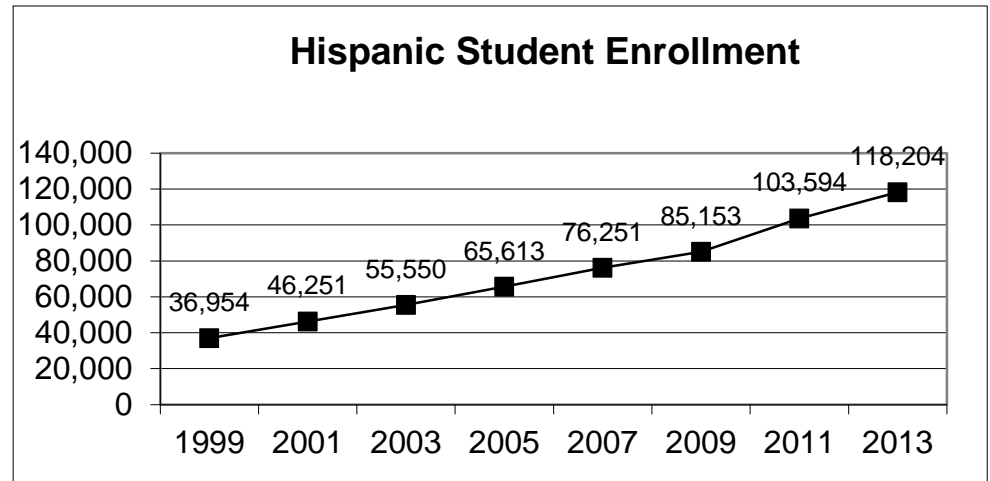

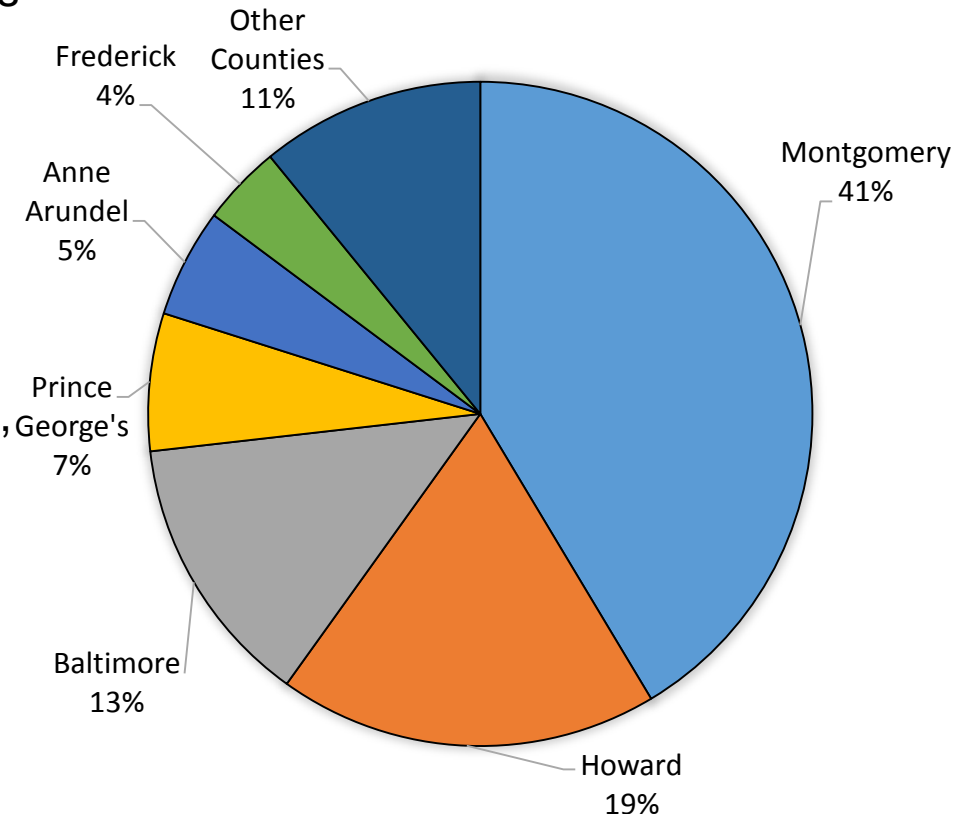

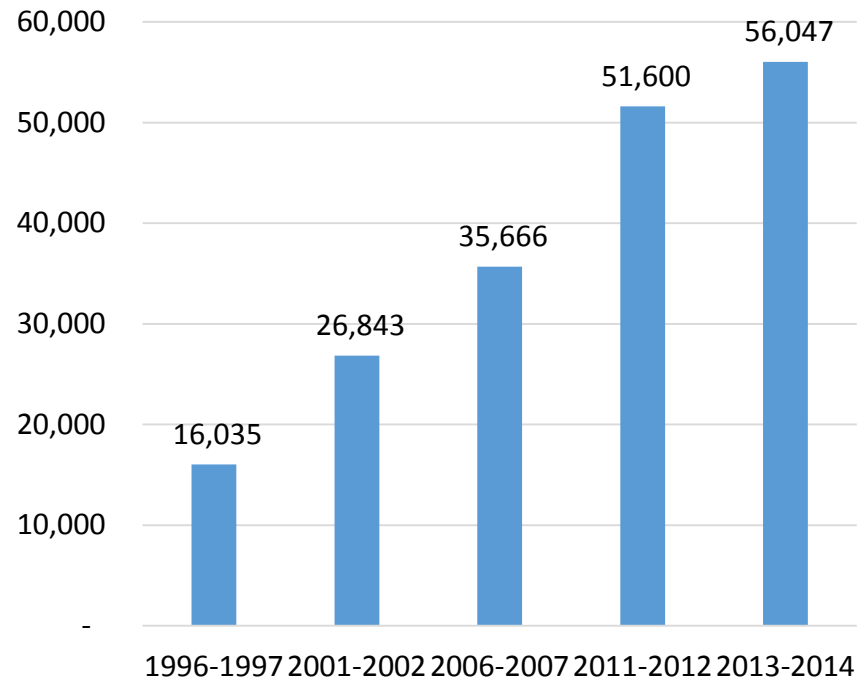

English Language Learner Population in Maryland Public Schools



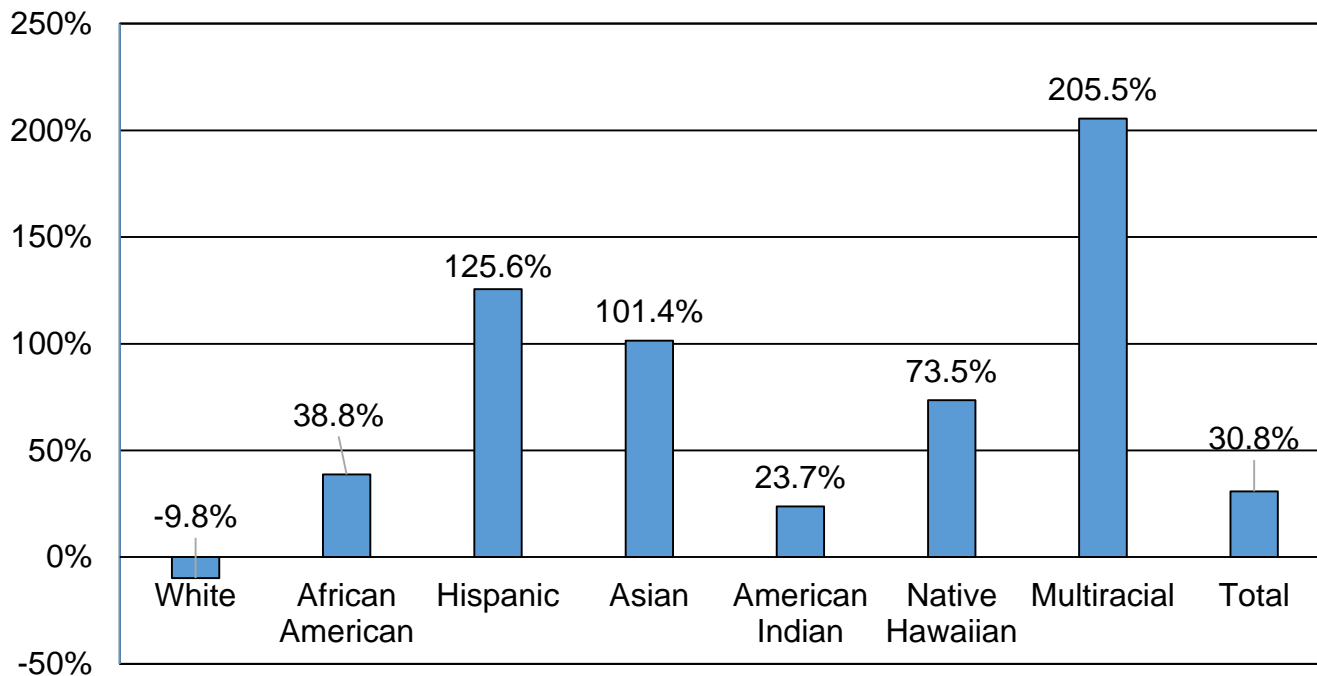

Racial and Ethnic Minorities Will Continue to Shape Maryland's Future

- Hispanics are the State's fastest growing population group followed by Asians
- The growing Hispanic and Asian presence is reflected each day in the State's public schools, universities, neighborhoods, and work sites
- The growth in the State's Hispanic and Asian communities has generated many opportunities, particularly in the areas of economic development through the creation of small businesses and a diverse and dedicated work force
- With opportunities come unique challenges – educational and health disparities, affordable housing, and equal access to public services

Improving Educational Levels Is Key to Ensuring a Strong State

- Disparities exist in the educational attainment of several minority groups in Maryland, particularly among Hispanics and African Americans
- Since Hispanics are the fastest growing population group in Maryland and African Americans are the largest minority group, it is critical that the educational levels of these groups improve as we move forward as a state and nation
- Unless disparities in educational attainment are reduced, the employment and income potential for many Hispanics and African Americans will most likely be diminished
