
General Election Voter Turnout Broken Down by Method 2020, 2022, 2024

- The extent to which voters in different counties use different voting methods can vary, as shown below.
- In 2024, for example, the percentage of votes cast in-person on Election Day (not accounting for provisional ballots cast on Election Day) ranged from 31% in Calvert County to 56% in Allegany County. Allegany and Caroline counties were the only counties in which more than 50% of voters cast their votes in person on Election Day (56% and 51%, respectively, not accounting for provisional ballots). In 16 other counties, in-person voting on Election Day was still the most popular voting method even though it was used by less than 50% of voters (not accounting for provisional ballots). In-person early voting was the most popular voting method in six counties (Calvert, Charles, Prince George's, Queen Anne's, St. Mary's, and Talbot) (not accounting for provisional ballots). In Montgomery County, the percentages of votes cast in-person on Election Day, in-person during early voting, and by mail were the most evenly distributed of any county (33%, 30%, and 32%, respectively).
