
Primary Election Voter Turnout (as a % of Eligible Registered Voters) – By County 2018, 2020, 2022

- Statewide, the percentage of eligible registered voters who voted in the 2018, 2020, and 2022 primary elections was 24%, 42%, and 27%, respectively. In a primary election, not all registered voters are eligible to vote. Only Democratic Party and Republican Party registered voters, and third party or unaffiliated registered voters who live in a jurisdiction in which a nonpartisan (*i.e.*, school board) race is being voted on, are eligible.
- Among the counties, the percentage of eligible registered voters who voted in the 2018, 2020, and 2022 primary elections varied from 17% to 36% in 2018, from 34% to 48% in 2020, and from 21% to 41% in 2022.
