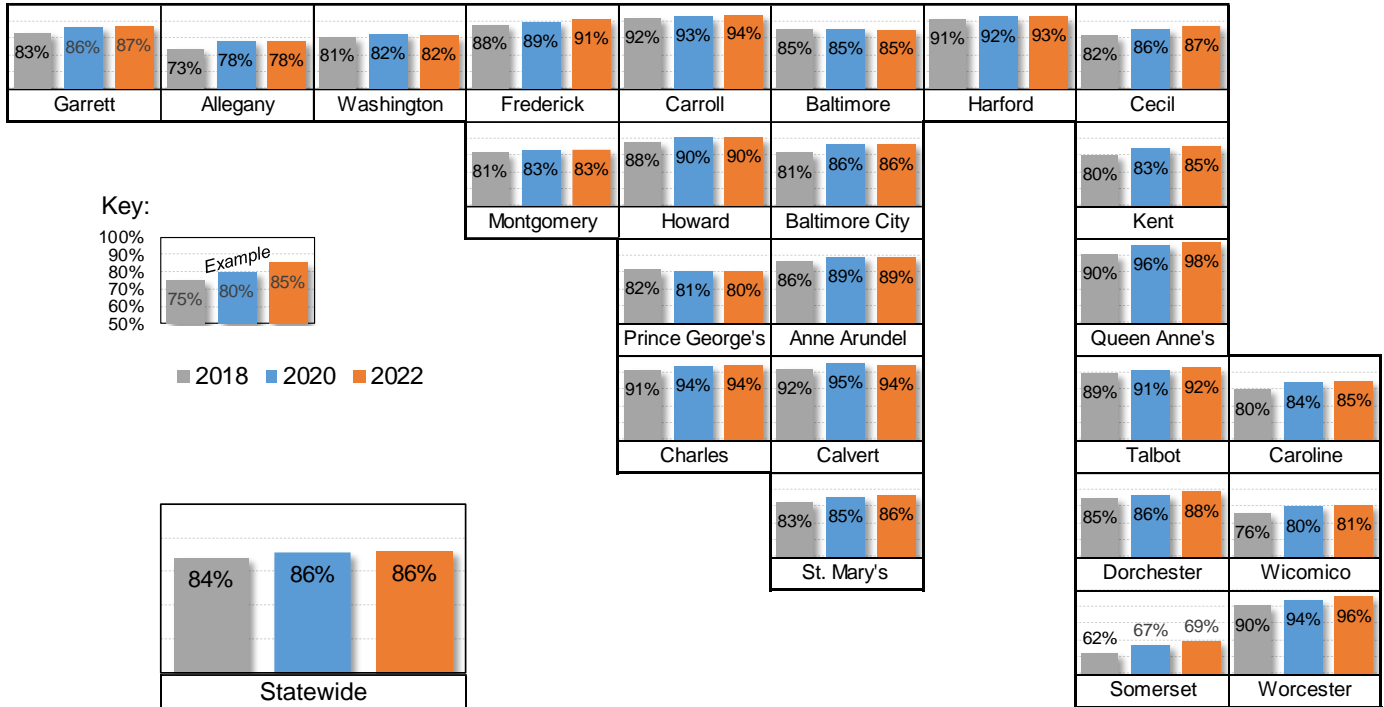


Registered Voters* (as a % of Voting Age Population) 2018, 2020, 2022

Notes: (1) Voting age (18 and over) population includes individuals who are not eligible to register to vote, including noncitizens and individuals in prison for a felony. Some jurisdictions' voter registration percentages above may be more affected than others' by populations that are not eligible to register to vote. Somerset County, for example, contains State prison facilities with a significant population relative to the county's overall voting age population, and, of all the counties, Montgomery and Prince George's counties' populations have the highest percentages of noncitizens. (2) Because voting age population estimates/counts for 2022 are not yet available from the U.S. Census Bureau, the voter registration percentages above, for 2022, are calculated using 2021 voting age population estimates, while the 2018 and 2020 voter registration percentages use 2018 and 2020 voting age population estimates, respectively. However, based on the magnitude of changes in the population estimates from year to year in recent years, the use of 2021 voting age population estimates instead of 2022 voting age population estimates should not affect the 2022 voter registration percentages by more than 1% - 2%, and in most cases the difference should be less than 1%.
